#### INCLEMENT WEATHER

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut-off to remain indoors. If the temperature, and/or wind chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We do expect all students to be dressed appropriately for the weather, as there are many cold days that students are expected to be outdoors.




#### **Community News**




