Lice Alert

Head lice has occurred in your child's classroom/daycare.

Head lice are common in preschool / school-age children and are no cause for alarm. Head lice are tiny, wingless insects that live on the scalp and cause itching and scratching. The lice eggs (nits) are firmly glued on the hair shaft close to the scalp.

Since head lice are easily spread, please check your child's head daily for 3 weeks and weekly thereafter. Teach your children not to share items like combs, brushes, hats, scarves, hair decorations and headphones.

- If you find <u>live lice</u> treat quickly and correctly. Special treatment shampoos, lotions or cream rinses are available at most drug stores. These products may contain insecticides. Follow the instructions on the bottle closely and use the amount suggested. All family members should be checked and treated if <u>live</u> <u>lice</u> are found.
- Repeat the treatment in one week.
- Some parents may choose to remove all nits using a fine toothed comb, fingers
 or tweezers over the next 7 to 10 days. This may help with diagnosis and
 prevent unnecessary retreatment and decrease the chance of self-reinfestation.
 Treatments are not always 100% effective.
- Children with head lice should not be excluded from school.
- Excessive household cleaning is not required. Washing items in prolonged or intimate contact with the head may be needed (e.g. hats, pillowcases, brushes and combs). Wash items in hot water, dry in a hot dryer for 15 minutes or store in an air tight plastic bag for 2 weeks or in a deep freeze for 24 hours.

If you find live lice please contact the school/daycare so parents can be asked to check their children for head lice and also families of your children's friends so they can act quickly.
